- **Q3.** A supermarket proposes different types of products: foodstuffs, objects and flowers. Each product has a bar code and a price. Foodstuffs have an expiry date and flowers have a fresh date.
- **Q4.** A building has several floors. Some of them are composed of offices and flats. Others are dedicated to parking. They are composed of several parking slots.
- **Q5.** A media library has different types of media that can be borrowed by the library subscribers.


Exercise 2
